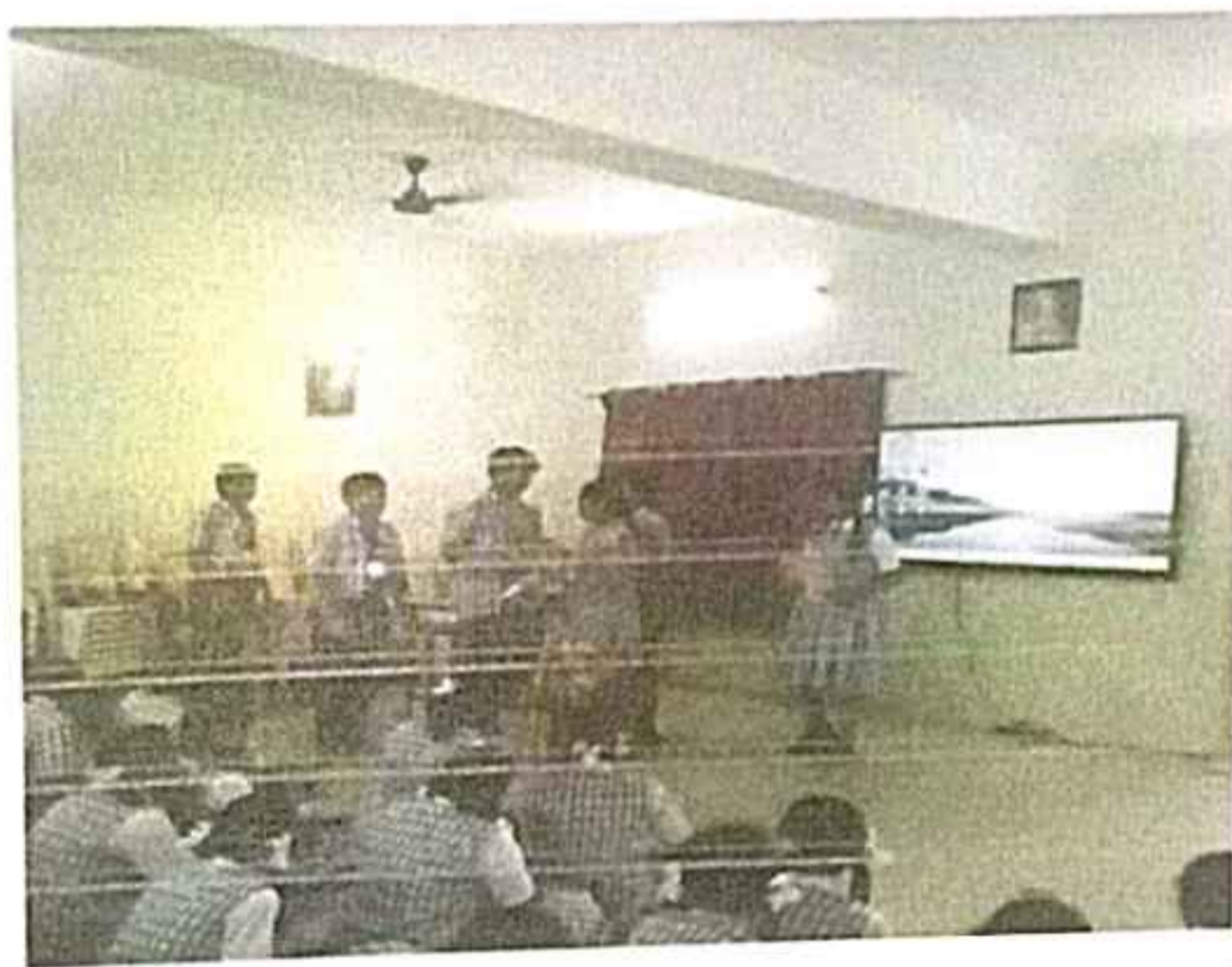
With her encouragement and blessing, the competition began.






